The 2012 Executive Committee comprised the following countries: Argentina, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Guyana, Haiti, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Suriname, United States of America, and Venezuela¹.

Ms. María Guadalupe Bardelli, Director of Regional Negotiations and Disputes of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock and Fisheries of Argentina, served as the Chairperson of the meeting, and Ms. Silvana Vallejo Páez, Deputy Minister for Rural Development of the Ministry of Agriculture, Livestock, Aquaculture and Fisheries of Ecuador, be elected to serve as rapporteur.
